In October, The Nottinghamshire Network of U3As held an Ageing Well Conference in association with the Nottingham University School of Psychology

Together with Paula Moran of the School of Psychology and with a team of U3A volunteers, a day was planned with two Keynote Talks and a choice of 14 workshops (run mainly by U3A members). More volunteers helped on the day and in true U3A fashion the conference ran without a hitch.

Part of the morning was spent in two workshops – from a choice of nine: Cognitive testing workshop; Attention and Driving; Ageing well, shopping well; Voice recognition for maintaining contact; Sleep and the over 50s; Design the dementia friendly house; Men and Ageing; Age UK Notts. Befriending service.

Finally the day was completed by each delegate attending one of five healthy sessions – Tai Chi, Cha Cha Cha, Singing for Fun, a walk around the beautiful university grounds and a Happiness Workshop.

In her Chair's report Rosie stressed that the year has been very successful for the Network highlighting the following points:

- * The Officers group continues to be at full capacity. These roles are vital to the network and after this meeting Terry Hardman will replace Rita Foulkes as treasurer.
- * The Support Group led by Paul Martinez works very effectively and the Network now has seven trained volunteers.
- * Three new U3As have been established: Wollaton, Calverton and Bulwell.
- * The Ageing Well conference was very well attended and extremely successful.
- * The 5 peer support group sessions have been well received and valued.
- * A very useful Speaker/ Seeker guidance booklet has been produced and a database which can be accessed through Group Talk.
- * The Network meetings have been well attended and covered a range of subjects including Innovations, Keeping U3As open, Recruitment and Social Prescription.
- * The Interest Group data base has been updated by Peter Edge.

After the coffee break we had a lively discussion about Social Prescription introduced by John Lewis of Bingham U3A.

- * Raising awareness of U3A in the doctors' surgeries
- * Putting brochures/posters/ in surgeries and asking doctors to give out newsletters to patients they think would benefit.
- * Ambassadors to look after new members.
- * Attendance at flu vaccine sessions to give out publicity.
- * Publicity on the local radio
