WARNING OF A SCAM FROM GEORGE GOLLEDGE OF EDWALTON, GAMSTON & DISTRICT u3a

There is a new and potentially alarming scam affecting u3as and I think it is wise to alert the other u3as in the Nottingham area to be aware of strange emails being directed at the Treasurer.

My treasurer phoned me yesterday because he had received an email apparently from me. It was addressed to "Treasurer "and not his Christian name. It requested a payment to be made but not how much or to whom. It also asked what the current balance was in our bank account. He replied to the email asking what the payment referred to and the reply he received asked for £1267, which is far higher than any payment our u3a ever makes. It also asked for the payment to be made by Paypal when we would normally only ever use cheques. The email address for me was not my correct email address but a made up one. My name and correct email address can easily be found if anyone Googled the newsletter for our u3a. I have asked the Treasurer to delete any further emails from this scammer and hopefully the problem will go away.

The following night on the BBC News there was a mention about scammers targeting people waiting for Covid injections. Someone must think that older members of U3A may also be a soft target

The Notts Network Peer Support Group for Secretaries—Report from Yvonne Haynes, West Bridgford u3a

Thank you all for attending the zoom chat. Hopefully you found it useful - I certainly did.

Items discussed

Whats App group. - Elaine offered to do a weekly bulletin of hints and tips on how to reduce the time it takes to do the job - everyone was in favour! If you are not yet in this group, follow the instructions on last month's notes and join. If you are not a WhatsApp user then wait for the next monthly report, where I will include them for you.

Marketing for recruitment (new members) - Updating the u3a Facebook page was a common approach, with some u3as further ahead than others where they have expertise within their membership. Others still using the u3a original formatting will need to wait for the Beacon update before this can be addressed, although the text and some of the layout can be improved.

Retford u3a has a monthly piece in the local free paper, which is successful in getting our message out. This is a news item rather than an advert.

Extra members via social prescribing was discussed, with a mixed response from u3as, where there was some worry about the expertise needed and time/responsibility considerations. Some u3as have forged a useful relationship with a local link worker who will be facilitating this, but the lockdown has hindered putting this together but it will be revisited in the future. Leafleting of local libraries and GP surgeries is common, but it was suggested that approaching a wider selection of churches/synagogues/temples may help address the widening of the ethnic mix of memberships. We are not aware of a way to record the ethnic mix of our members, but perhaps the new Pathfinders trial will throw up some strategies for this. Encouraging a more diverse group of people to come on to the committees would be a good start.

Committee strength – Generally, it was the case that there is difficulty in getting enough committee members; in one case the existence of the u3a is in jeopardy. We weren't sure if it would be feasible to share knowledge and expertise to help out local u3as where they have a particular difficulty. Most u3as have advertised in newsletters and emails for more members to come forward, some offering the idea of shadowing initially or sharing job roles. This is one way of introducing someone to the new role whilst offering support and expertise.

Some participants thought it should be possible for committee members to move around the roles, but the danger here is to not welcome in new ideas and approaches. The Treasurer role seemed to be a particularly difficult one to fill.

Consideration could be given to asking on the original application form what skills the new member may have to offer? It would also be useful for the u3a site to have a list of resources which may help.

Other items - The PR role had posed a particular problem with some u3as; it is not necessarily a committee member position. Claire will distribute their job spec for it, but it did sound rather overwhelming!

The next meeting of the group is **Tuesday 9th February at 2.00pm. Please note the change of time.** The Zoom link will be sent nearer the time.


MANSFIELD & DISTRICT u3a
