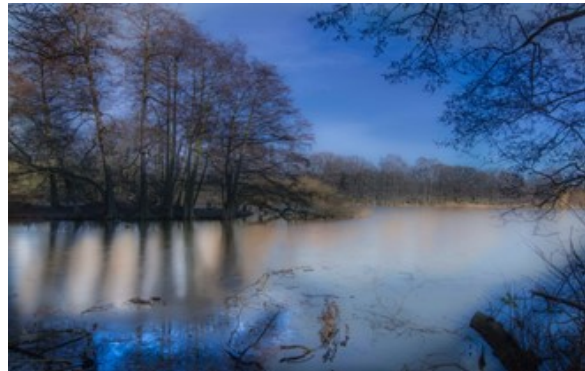

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR OF NOTTS NETWORK

Our first Notts Network meeting of the year was held on January 27th with 44 attendees and 28 of the 33 u3as represented. PUBLIC RELATIONS

Hello I am Chris Hartny-Mills a newly appointed Public Relations Advisor for the East Midland Region.

It is no secret the u3a membership numbers across the nation have been in decline over the past few years. The advent of C-19 has accelerated this and it is anticipated that membership numbers this year will be down by 20% to 25%. This means we must not only do more to retain existing members, but we must be prepared to recruit new ones. **PR is the fore-runner of recruitment, it's all about creating awareness in our geographical areas, all of which vary from urban to extremely rural. This has bought about the creation of my role of PR Advisor.**

What's a PR Advisor?

My role is to work in an advisory capacity, working alongside u3as across the region trying to identify areas where we can possibly spread the awareness of the u3a and make a real impact and promote the growth of numbers. There are many untapped opportunities which will widen the web of awareness and every u3a will have different activities that will bring the highest yield.

I have no illusions that some u3as will be further down the track than others, and may feel they have all of the bases covered, maybe these are experiences that other u3as may find very useful?

I am covering all of the u3as across the East Midland Region, which is 117 u3as. For me to be effective as a PR Advisor will be dependent on me developing a two way communications network. I have asked, via a message from Jean Hogg, for all u3as to send me contact details of their PR representative, who I am dubbing **Newshounds**.



A Newshound will receive help and information from me and will also provide me with news of what they are doing to help spread the word. This is beginning to happen already press releases are being circulated to other Newshounds and I am building a rapport with certain u3as who are willing to help, or who are in need of help.

PR obviously comes to the fore when we discuss u3a Day plans, and this will be an area of heavy concentration over the coming months. I also plan to hold some Zoom meetings of six or eight Newshounds where we can exchange ideas and suggestions, I will select a mixture of attendees with different levels of experience to compare notes. I am aiming to be as accessible as I can, I will attend committee meetings, when asked, to explain about my role and see how I can help each and every u3a that needs me.

By working together we will strive to find these opportunities and get to spread the u3a name and express details about the culture of the u3a to as many people that we possibly can. As I said this is a brand new role with a massive remit, it will take a while before it becomes really effective, but I will do my very best to provide a service to every u3a that gets in touch with me.
