Edwalton, Gamston & District U3A firing on all cylinders!

On 6 July 16 members of Edwalton, Gamston & District U3A Science and Technology group visited the Grade II listed pumping station in Papplewick near Ravenshead in North Nottingham.

"It just felt as though we were coming out of a long dark tunnel" said Carol Shuttleworth who organised the visit. "This was the first time since the start of lockdown when any of us had been able to talk to each other except for regular Zoom meetings".

Led by volunteer tour guide Peter Nicholls, the group heard about the very harsh working conditions at the pumping station. Early death awaited not only the men who stoked the boilers but also the women who painted the ornate flowers which decorate the supporting columns in the pump house as the paint they used contained arsenic. The engineering genius of the Victorians however was unbelievable - from the 200 foot shafts dug into the ground to extract clean water to the enormous 13 ton beam engines which are steam driven.



The pumping station was built in the early 1880's when two beam engines were installed. They then built a Gothic revival building around the beam engines and, because the project had come in on budget, they splashed out on stained glass windows for the pump house!

From September it is all systems go as monthly meetings begin with an AGM followed by a fascinating talk on the multi million pound restoration of Nottingham Castle.
